CAN GOD CALL YOU...?

HIS SERVANT

God referred to Job as His servant: “And the Lord said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil” (Job 1:8). Notice when God called Job **His servant**. Satan had come before God when the angels came to present themselves before God. Satan implied that he was having his way on the earth and with the people living on the earth. It was in this moment that God called Job His servant. When Satan thought he had control of those on the earth, God said, “Hast thou considered my servant Job?” God knew that Job was His servant and knew that Job would be faithful to Him through anything. Job would come out of the trial as gold because he was gold all along (Job 23:10).

HIS FRIEND

God referred to Abraham as His friend. James recorded: “Was not Abraham our father justified by works, ... And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God” (James 1:21-23). Abraham was called the friend of God after that he had obeyed the commands that God had given unto him. God commanded Abraham to offer his son Isaac. Abraham did not question the command of God or look for a way around it. Instead, he rose up early in the morning to obey God: “And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and saddled his ass, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son, and clave the wood for the burnt offering, and rose up, and went unto the place of which God had told him” (Genesis 22:5).

If we desire for God to call us His servant, then we must submit to His will and obey His commands. If God is going to refer to us as His friend, then we must follow the example of Abraham and obey the commands of God. Jesus said: “Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you” (John 15:14). **Jesse Claunch**
